## 6<sup>th</sup> Grade

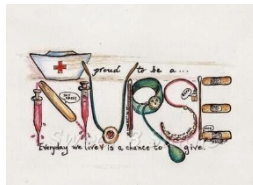
- TI-30XIIS calculator label with paint pen or permanent marker
- 6 folders with pockets and prongs - 2 colors of choice (Red, Blue, Green, Yellow)
- 4-pkgs of notebook paper
- 2-copy paper
- 4 packages #2 pencils (24 count)
- 2-graph paper
- 2-boxes of Kleenex
- 1-bottle Germ-X
- 4-glue sticks 2-pks 3x5 index cards
- Expo Markers
- 1-pair of scissors
- 1-pk colored pencils
- 1-pk of highlighters
- Regular Markers
- 2-cap erasers

## 7<sup>th</sup> Grade

- TI-30XIIS calculator label with paint pen or permanent marker
- 1-pocket folder w/prongs
- 3-pkgs pencils
- Boxes of Kleenex
- If you purchase mechanical pencils, you must provide #2 lead and extra erasers for the pencils
- 1-pkg colored pencils and skinny markers
- 1-pkg of copy paper
- 1-bottle Germ-X

## 8<sup>th</sup> Grade

- TI-30XIIS calculator label with paint pen or permanent marker
- 2-boxes of Kleenex
- 2-pks-Copy paper
- 2-pks-glue sticks
- 3-subject spiral notebooks
- Pencils
- graph paper

## **Immunization Requirements:**

Children who start Preschool, Pre-K, Kindergarten, 7<sup>th</sup> grade, or are a first-time student starting school in TN, will need an official TN Certificate of Immunization to provide the school when asked for an immunization certificate. Parents & guardians must get the certificate from health department or health care provider licensed in Tennessee.

### **Entering Preschool & Pre-K:**

- Hepatitis B (HBV)
- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTaP, or DT if appropriate)
- Poliomyelitis (IPV or OPV)
- Haemophilus influenzae type B (Hib) - age younger than 5 years only
- Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV) - age younger than 5 years only
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella - 1 dose of each, normally given together as MMR
- Varicella - 1 dose or credible history of disease
- Hepatitis A - 1 dose, required by 18 months of age or older

### **Entering Kindergarten:**

- Hepatitis B (HBV)
- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTaP, or DT if appropriate)
- Poliomyelitis (IPV or OPV) - final dose on or after the 4th birthday
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella - 2 doses of each, usually given together as MMR
- Varicella - 2 doses or credible history of disease
- Hepatitis A - total of 2 doses, spaced at least 6 - 18 months apart

### **Note on 7<sup>th</sup> Grade vaccinations**

Doctors recommend three vaccines for all pre-teens, beginning at age 11: the first meningitis vaccine (a second is needed at age 16), the HPV cancer vaccine (2 doses), and the Tdap booster (the one required for 7th grade). We also recommend an annual flu vaccine. If a child needs a Tdap booster, he or she can get all recommended vaccines at the same visit.

### **Entering 7<sup>th</sup> Grade:**

- Tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis booster (Tdap) - evidence of one Tdap dose given any time before 7th grade entry is required regardless of Td history
- Varicella - 2 doses or credible history of disease

### **New Enrollee in a grade other than K:**

- Hepatitis B (HBV)
- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTaP, or DT if appropriate)
- Poliomyelitis (IPV or OPV) - final dose on or after the 4th birthday
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella - 2 doses of each, normally given together as MMR
- Varicella - 2 doses or credible history of disease
- New students entering grades other than 7th grade are not required to have Tdap

### **What if I can't afford the vaccines?**

**Cost should not prevent you from vaccinating your child.** Children and teens younger than 19, who have TennCare or don't have health insurance, can receive free vaccines through the federal Vaccines for Children (VFC) Program in participating private medical offices and health departments. Ask your child's health care provider if they participate in VFC. If your child has health insurance that doesn't pay for vaccines and you can't afford them, the Tipton Co. Health Department can provide the vaccines. Health departments and VFC providers charge a small administration fee to give them free vaccine, which can be adjusted based on your income.
